Today is the First Sunday of Advent, and the parish choir will begin singing at the 11:00 AM Mass for the first time. We have been rehearsing for the last few months and are excited and grateful to finally be singing at Mass.

You will notice our new parish hymnal, the *St. Michael Hymnal*, in the pews. The hymnal includes a beautiful collection of entrance antiphons, starting at #300, "No one who waits for you is ever put to shame". Each week we will begin Mass by singing the entrance antiphon (introit) proper to the week.

The Mass setting we will sing is Mass XVII, which the Church gives us for use on Sundays of Advent and Lent. You can find the Kyrie (Lord, Have Mercy) at #121, the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) at #122, and the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) at #123 in the hymnal. PRAYER FOR THE ADVENT WREATH



Lord, our God, we praise You for Your Son, Jesus Christ, for He is Emmanuel, the Hope of all people. He is the Wisdom that teaches and guides us. He is the Savior of us all. O Lord, let your blessing come upon us as we light the first (purple) candle of this wreath. May the wreath and its light

be a sign of Christ's promise of salvation. May He come quickly and not delay. We ask this in His holy name. Amen.

Waiting

We light a candle today, a small dim light against a world that often seems forbidding and dark. But we light it because we are a people of hope, a people whose faith is marked by an expectation that we should always be ready for the coming of the Master. The joy and anticipation of this season is captured beautifully in the antiphons of hope from the monastic liturgies:

See! The ruler of the earth shall come, the Lord who will take from us the heavy burden of our exile. The Lord will come soon, will not delay. The Lord will make the darkest places bright. We must capture that urgency today in the small flame of our candle. We light the candle because we know that the coming of Christ is tied to our building of the kingdom. Lighting the flame, feeding the hungry, comforting the sick, reconciling the divided, praying for the repentant, greeting the lonely and forgotten – doing all these works hastens His coming.
